
Thank you for supporting our fall fundraising campaign!

The individuals we serve do not require (or want) the higher level of support offered in a group home, but can thrive with typically four to eight hours per week of OP staff support. Teams generally focus on developing a routine with laundry, cleaning, budgeting, medical appointments, grocery shopping, and cooking.

We have seen how independent living enhances quality of life and promotes inclusion in a person's broader community. The financial model for this sought-after program requires we ask our community for support. Thanks to the Schulze Family Foundation and our generous donors, we can continue to provide this needed program.
