#### Warren's story

Warren gave a speech at the OP Gala, describing how OP has helped him for 30 years. Here is an excerpt:

After graduating from high school, my parents, Wyn and Myrtle, found a home for me through Opportunity Partners. At the time, OP operated a large facility in Minneapolis where I lived until moving to a

group home, and later to my own condominium where I receive in-home services through OP.

For many years, I worked at the Minneapolis Airport, escorting people for their flights. It was one of my favorite jobs. I even saw Prince at the airport – that was a thrill! Currently I am working a few days a week as part of an OP team at Uponor doing light packaging.

In my free time, I spend time with my girlfriend Ann and volunteer frequently at community events. I also have rallied at the Capitol to advocate for higher wages for OP caregivers.

Like many people, I had a very difficult time during the isolation of the pandemic. **OP stayed in touch with me and helped lift my spirits.** I really appreciate my staff for helping me with picking up groceries, getting to appointments and making sure I am doing well. They also helped me start OP virtual services where I've reconnected with friends, which has been wonderful.

#### Laura's story

OP has been a part of Laura's life for more than a decade, enriching her days with art classes, friendships and the opportunity to work and earn a paycheck in a supported environment.

Although Laura has worked since she was a teenager, working independently in the community brought challenges at times. Then her parents, Tom and Cheryl Green, found Opportunity Partners. Over the years, Laura gained confidence

and success at OP-Asplin Center, where she was surrounded by peers and staff who care.

"My favorite part about OP is seeing my friends, working with (my staff) Troy, and getting paid," Laura explained.

After the death of Laura's parents and the challenges of the pandemic, OP became even more critical for Laura and her siblings, Heather and Ryan, who share guardianship.

"OP's coaching and support has really helped Laura shine," Ryan said.

OP Gala in person last spring, and we'll be holding our Success Celebration this fall at Veteran's Memorial Park in Richfield. Looking ahead, we'll continue to plan other activities and events that we can do safely, and we'll use what we've learned over the last two years to be ready to pivot again if needed.

Many OP staff and persons served who worked during the pandemic were eligible to apply for the frontline worker pay announced in June. I believe this will provide an encouraging boost for those who worked so hard throughout COVID-19. My sincere thank you to those who sacrificed so much in order to keep things running smoothly.

The 2022 Legislative session ended last spring with disappointing news that lawmakers did not prioritize disability waiver services such as what OP provides. We know that our services are critical for people with disabilities, and we urgently need sustainable investments to keep the disability care system from collapsing. Minnesotans with disabilities need and deserve more!

Across the state, waiting lists for day services are climbing and some residential group homes are closing – mostly due to the dire staffing shortage affecting so many industries. We recognize many of you are still waiting for your loved one to return to services. I realize this is causing much hardship and uncertainty. We do hope to see some movement soon as we continue to ramp up our hiring efforts.

Thank you to everyone who responded to our legislative action alerts throughout the session. We will continue to advocate – we know services that help people with disabilities live their best life are crucial. You can help at *opportunities.org/advocate*

#### Sven Saw: A long partnership with a rich history

Opportunity Partners recently received a shipment of blades and handles, ready for assembly. The parts make up the Sven Saw® – a portable, folding campfire saw that OP has been assembling since the 1970s. Linnea Swenson Tellekson, President of Swen Products, has carried on the legacy of her father's invention through the family-owned company.

The idea of the Sven Saw was born when Linnea's father, Richard Swenson, was headed to the Boundary Waters with his brother. The pair came across a group of campers, one of which had injured himself with an axe. Seeing the need for a safer, more portable tool, Richard created his own compact folding saw with a blade that's protected by its own handle.

Soon after, he traveled to Seattle for the World's Fair in 1962. He sold six saws to mountaineer Jim Whittaker at Recreational Equipment, Incorporated (REI). Jim

soon ordered 12 more and became the first American to summit Mount Everest a year later.

Since the inception of the saw, the family-owned and operated company's parts are entirely manufactured and packaged in Minnesota.

#### "We are very proud that the whole saw is manufactured and packaged in Minnesota," said Linnea.

While Richard continued his career as an engineer, his sister-in-law Delores ran the new company. Linnea remembers assembling the saws alongside her cousins as a young girl in her aunt's basement before the partnership with OP began.

Through Richard's relationship with Coghlan's founder Norm Coghlan, OP started working with Swen Products to assemble and package the Sven Saws. By 1975, the saws were completely packaged and assembled through OP, and the partnership has continued ever since. In the last 12 months, over 14,000 saws have been packaged and assembled by OP!

"Being a part of OP's work is an important aspect of full inclusion in our society," said Linnea. "We have always felt like we're a part of the same family."
